Maths: These sessions for the week will be on the video call.

- 1) Access the 'Premium Resources Centre' orange tab on the right hand side of the screen.
- 2) Go to 'My account' and enter the following login details:

- 3) Scroll down to 'Spring Block 3' and open 'Decimals and Percentages'
- 4) Within this you will have several options appear but for each day you will need to scroll down and select on:
Monday: Understanding percentages
Tuesday: Percentages as decimals and fractions
Wednesday: Equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages
Thursday: Order and compare decimals
