- 1. Picking your favourite topics to read by clicking 'see more' and clicking on the 3 hearts at the top of the page. Then choose your favourite topics to read using the smiley faces.
- 2. Create your own avatar
- 3. Pick a book to start reading by clicking on library and selecting a book.
- 4. When reading your book use the dictionary tab to find the meaning of 2 words.
- 5. From the book you are reading, use the journal tab to copy phrases that you like. These could be phrases that use ambitious vocabulary, interesting openers or description, a fact you enjoyed reading or something that made you laugh.

Next take a look at our next project. This is linked to our topic work this week. For this project we would like you to research about migrating animals. Remember you can copy facts that you have read onto your journal page which you can use when completing the writing task on myON. Then using this research write an explanation piece of writing Titled 'Why do animals migrate?' Use the checklist in myON to help you to do this.

Computing

Create a power point presentation which presents your information that you have researched about migrating animals. You could include pictures of the animals and maps showing where they migrate from and to. You could change the background of your slide and use different coloured fonts. Try to include at least one timed transition between two slides and use an effect.

Science/Topic

Watch the videos about migrating animals and make notes to use in your PowerPoint. Try to record why animals migrate, where they migrate to and how far they travel.
