### For Week Beginning Monday 1<sup>st</sup> June 2020

To kick off this term we would have been looking at several aspects of the human body so we have included some activities here amongst others not related to the human body:

1. Can you draw and label the heart and lungs of a human? You can research online with the help of a parent to produce your own labelled diagram. Don't forget to include some of the technical language to help label the diagram.
2. Produce an explanation text on what happens when we breathe. The link provided explains how we breathe in a lot of detail and you could use that to help you produce your own work. <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=8NUxwJS-Ok> (Warning the commentary is American)
3. Have a go at drawing a person in proportion. The link provided shows a video that you could copy to have a go at drawing a person. <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=O-z66n224pM> You may want to turn the music down on it though as it is a bit annoying after a while.
4. There are several activities you could have a go at here: Can you come up with your own words to go over the intro? Can you give your own name to one of the characters you see and write a description about them? Can you write us a letter persuading us which character is the best and why? Can you paint, sketch, draw, collage, pastel (whichever you like really) the setting you can see in the background of the clip? If you want to research the actual characters names to do any of this then go for it!

### Sports Leaders/PE and Sport Learning:

Usually during the summer term, we encourage children in Year 5 to apply to become Sports Leaders within the school community. Unfortunately, we can't do that in school this year so we are opening it up to the children whilst they are at home. One of their responsibilities would have been to run KS1

Sports Day with Miss Peers and Mr Gregory. We would like you to design an activity that the younger children could have done at their Sports Day as one of the round robin activities. Remember it needs to be fairly easy for younger children to follow and not be too difficult to physically do. You can use any of the equipment you can think of that the school already has. Design and plan your ideas onto paper, powerpoint or even video clips if you like?

There are several of you that we know would be excellent role models for younger children in the school and just because you may not be the 'best' at PE and sport doesn't mean you won't be good at this. There is no limit of Sports Leaders either so please don't limit yourselves either.
