- It is even more crucial that you upload your own observations of your child's learning to Tapestry as this will ensure we can assess their progress against the EYFS curriculum and the Characteristics of Effective Learning.
- Complete the School Reading Challenge.












A game for two or more players

You will need: scissors.

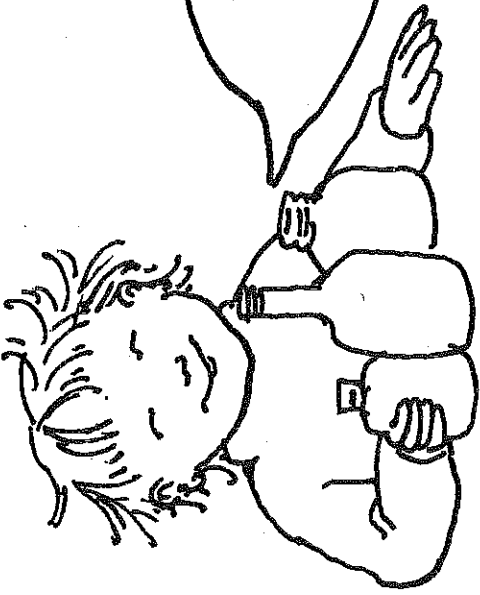
- Cut out the cards.

- The winner is the player with the most pairs when all the cards have been used up.



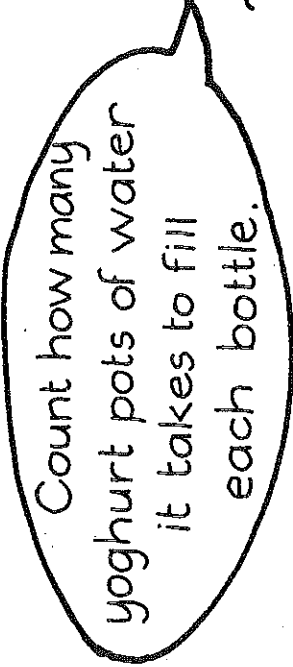
