Maths

Just like last week you need to visit the White Rose Maths home learning site

<https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-4/>. You will need a pen/pencil, paper and a ruler will help if you need to draw out any place value grids.

This week you need to complete the activities on **week 2** (click on where it says week 2). You need to **complete the 5 lessons**:

- Divide 2 digits by 10
- Hundredths
- Hundredths as decimals
- Hundredths on a place value grid
- Divide 1 or 2 digit numbers by 100.

Watch the videos and work through the questions on the worksheet (found by clicking 'Get the activity') when it tells you to. You will need to pause the video to work through the questions and then press play again once you have done the questions you were asked to. When you have finished get an adult to check your answers and working out with you by clicking 'Get the answers'.

English - Reading and Writing

Please ensure that your child is reading 30 minutes a day and that you are reading with your child often and they are recording it in their 'Home School Diary'. They need to be taking tests in Accelerated Reader as often as possible. Your child could also write reviews of the books they read to share with the class when we return to school.

To introduce our new topic of Land, Sea and Sky, this week we would also like your child to write a descriptive piece using the clip 'onceinalifetime' from Literacy shed - <https://www.literacyshed.com/onceinalifetime.html>

We would like you to describe what the elderly man can see/hear and how he feels when he first spots the turtles flying in the sky. Think about using ambitious vocabulary and what effect your word choices has on the reader e.g. portraying the elderly man's surprise or worry. Remember to use expanded noun phrases with description around the noun and to use a variety of sentence openers.

We would also like you to write the next part of the clip. Be as creative as you can and maybe include a conversation between the man and turtle. Where do the turtles take the elderly man? What does he see on his journey? Does he regret leaving his home or is excited to be on this journey?
