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Due to the uncertainty and unknown of the current situation we find ourselves in, all packs/ work after this will be uploaded to the website for you to access.





Easter

Easter is an important Christian festival, when Christians remember the death and **resurrection** of Jesus, who Christians believe to be the son of God.

Most Christians refer to the week before Easter as Holy Week. During this week, Christians remember the last week of Jesus' life. Holy Week contains many special days for Christians, beginning with Palm Sunday.

Palm Sunday

The Bible says that, on this day, Jesus and his disciples walked to Jerusalem for a Passover meal. Jesus sent two of his disciples to find a donkey. They brought the donkey to Jesus and draped cloaks on its back so that Jesus could ride on it. Lots of people had heard that Jesus was about to arrive so a large crowd had gathered to welcome him. As Jesus rode the donkey into Jerusalem, the crowd took palm leaves from



the trees, laying them on the ground and waving them in the air in celebration.

Maundy Thursday

On this day, Jesus and his disciples gathered together to eat their last meal together, known as The Last Supper. As his friends gathered at the house, Jesus surprised them by washing their feet and told them that they should always love one another.

Jesus then passed bread and wine around the table. He explained that, after his death, his friends should share bread and wine to remember him by. It was later in the evening on Maundy Thursday when Jesus was betrayed by one his disciples, named Judas.

Good Friday

It was on Good Friday that Christians believe that Jesus died. Jesus was made to carry a heavy, wooden cross through the city to the place where he would be crucified. The Roman guards nailed Jesus






to the cross and placed a crown made of thorns on his head. Some Christians believe that, as Jesus suffered, the sky turned black.

Holy Saturday


According to the Bible, the tomb of Jesus was found empty when his friends and family visited it. A heavy stone was rolled in front of the tomb's entrance and it was guarded by a Roman soldier.

Easter Sunday

Easter Sunday is a happy day for Christians because it is the day that they believe that Jesus



To celebrate Jesus' resurrection, special church services are held on this day. Gifts, including Easter eggs, are given and the church is filled with flowers which symbolise new life.
