 Thank you for airing this. From an external perspective, it can be hard for you to see the progress so it's a good opportunity for us to share a response. Due to covid, all regular Of sted visits had to be put on hold and all statutory assessment points did too. As a result, it could look as if there has been little change since the Of sted that judged us RI in June 2019. Very positive feedback has been shared from the Local Authority (LA) during their numerous visits and our two Of sted visits in March and May 2021, were very positive. - 23. Would be really good if the teachers responded to emails quickly. I wanted to help my child with their learning and emailed asking what areas to cover with him. I got no reply, he was invited to interventions but couldn't attend. Then the report shows lack of progress but I was trying to get the information I needed to help him... hope he catches up in year 4.

 As a team, we try really hard to respond to emails quickly apologies if an email has been missed. I would recommend that you call the school, or pop into the office, if this happens again. Intervention groups are a strong way of us supporting gaps in knowledge and boosting progress. If you want to know more about a group, going forward, please always make contact. Thank you
- 24. I've hardly used the Arbor app, I found the old system much better

 Sorry that you don't find Arbor as straightforward to use as ParentMail. In school, we find it invaluable for pulling together behaviour, attendance, data, communication etc.

 Let us know if you'd like any training to support this; it could of course be more down to preference though.
- 25. Ms McKenzie works so hard and has made my daughters first year at school amazing. Her pastoral care has been second to none and very much appreciated. All of the EYFS staff work incredibly hard.

- 27. We were happy with the approach of leaders of DPS when we transferred here. Mrs Rice is far the best head teacher I've met so far. The school is brilliant.

- 28. Very disappointing experience over the 6 years. Very pleased my child has moved on from this awful school which needs to look at the leadership, around the repeated Ofsted failures and lack of progress to improve.

Oh dear. Sorry that you feel like this. Six years is a very long time to be unhappy. Please be reminded that open communication is the key either with class teachers, myself or the governors. I wouldn't suggest that anyone bottles up their feeing for such a long time as this really isn't healthy. Every school is very different and it seems like DPS wasn't a good choice for you despite the over and above efforts of the team.

29. This year my son has commented several times that "naughty children" or "children that cry" get "to do what they want." He has said several times that if you are naughty or start crying you don't have to do your work or you're allowed to leave the classroom. He has also commented that they get to do more "fun things like forest school". I think he feels like they don't seem to miss anything as punishment and in fact get to do it more often / have added privileges. I understand that the actions that are taken are taken for a reason but I wanted to comment how it's coming across to some others in the class.
